Ithaca, NY—Historic Ithaca’s Executive Director, Susan Holland, has stepped down from her role to take a new position in the community. Susan has been at the helm of Historic Ithaca since November 2017. In her seven years there, she has led the organization through the COVID-pandemic, advocated to save buildings with successful outcomes with the Stone House in Enfield and the “Red House” in Ithaca and is a founding member of CR0WD (Circularity, Reuse Zero Waste Development). The programs of Historic Ithaca such as Significant Elements and Work Preserve have grown in alignment with the mission and goals of preservation and sustainability under her leadership.
